A charming ancient woodland of remarkable diversity, featuring oak, birch, sweet chestnut, western hemlock, larch, Douglas fir and many other species. Located near Lamberhurst, just off the A21.

Description

Hinge Wood is an attractive mixed ancient woodland featuring oak, birch, sweet chestnut, western hemlock, larch, Douglas fir and many other species (see 'Trees' section below for more information).

Hinge Wood is situated in a tranquil rural setting within the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) just north of Bewl Water near Lamberhurst in Kent. It offers the perfect setting for private family camping, outdoor adventures, and peaceful woodland escapes.

A stoned track provides access to the wood. There is an additional unsurfaced track providing access to the west side of the wood. (see 'Wood Maps'). There is a place for a new owner to park within the wood itself. A recently installed rustic bench provides the perfect spot to simply sit and immerse in nature.

The purchasers of the woodland will be asked to enter into a [covenant](#) to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of adjoining woodlands and meadows.

Trees

Hinge Wood is an incredibly diverse ancient mixed woodland. To the west of the ride stop entrance there is a belt of woodland following the ride edge with an 'intimate mix of species' including western hemlock, larch and Douglas fir interspersed by sweet chestnut, silver birch and oak. To the north of this area is an oak plantation, planted approx. 35 years ago, with silver birch understory, some wild cherry, some older oak standards, ash, hazel, elder and a small pocket of conifers, including western hemlock and grand fir. The southeast area of Hinge Wood includes silver birch and sweet chestnut coppice with a few oak standards and goat willow found in the understory.

Hinge Wood has been designated as [Ancient Semi Natural Woodland \(ASNW\)](#) by [Natural England](#). Patches of Dogs Mercury can be found in the wood, an ancient woodland indicator. Ancient semi natural woodland is woodland that has been under constant tree cover since at least 1600AD. It is valued as a rich reserve of biodiversity. There is a draft Woodland Management Plan for Wiskett's Wood (of which Hinge Wood is a part) - details of this are available upon request.

Wildlife

Brown Long-eared bats have been recorded in Wiskett's Wood, as well as reports of turtle dove, lapwing and skylark. Fallow and Roe deer can be found in the wider woodland.

Features

- Easily accessed from the A21, with a stoned track leading to the wood itself.
- An incredibly diverse ancient woodland - with both broadleaf and conifer species.
- Privately owned woodlands on all sides.
- Located near Bewl Water and Scotney Castle - there is lots to do locally.

Access, tracks and footpaths

Hinge Wood is easily accessed from a quiet country lane (Bewlbridge Lane), through a locked metal gate (an owner will be provided the combination number for this locked gate). A stoned track provides access to the wood. There is an additional unsurfaced track providing access to the west side of the wood. (see 'Wood Maps'). There is a place for a new owner to park within the wood itself.

There are no public footpaths within the wood itself or adjoining the woodland.

Rights and covenants

The wood is sold with the sporting rights.

The purchasers of the woodland will be asked to enter into a [covenant](#) to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of adjoining woodlands and meadows.

Activities

Hinge Wood is a delightful family woodland, perfect for private camping and a variety of outdoor pursuits such as building wildlife hides for photography, creating meandering private woodland paths, or collecting firewood. It provides an excellent opportunity for a new owner to take on the rewarding role of caring for and managing an ancient woodland.

Local area and history

There are many historical sites in the area. The English Heritage site of [Bayham Abbey](#) is approx. 4.5 miles away and features ruins dating back to the 13th century. [Scotney Castle](#) is just over 1 mile away – this impressive 14th century moated castle is well worth a visit. For those who love water, [Bewl Water](#) is less than half a mile down the road from the woods and offers various water sports including sailing and stand up paddle boarding, as well as cycling and fishing.

Historically, Wiskett's Wood was likely to have been coppiced on rotation to supply wood for charcoal making (to support the Wealden Iron Industry), and later, to provide surrounding farms with hop poles, firewood and fencing materials.

How to find this woodland

You are welcome to visit this wood by yourself, but please ensure that you have a copy of these sales details with you - many of our woodlands do not have mobile phone reception or internet access so we recommend either printing the details or downloading them to your phone/tablet/laptop.

Do remember to also check that it is still available for sale. If you have seen the woodland and wish to be accompanied on a second more detailed visit please contact our local manager.

Directions

Please note, for satellite navigation, use the post code TN3 8JH. This will take you to the area as shown by the red dot on the map. Coordinates to the gate leading to Hinge Wood (off Bewlbridge Lane) are: N51.083661, E0.397466. To find the wood follow the instructions below.

Heading south on the A21

- Heading south past the exits for Royal Tunbridge Wells and Pembury, continue heading south until you reach the roundabout at Kipping's Cross.
- Go straight over at Kipping's Cross and continue straight over at the next roundabout (this is the turning to the BP garage and Burger King).
- Continue 3 miles south on the A21 crossing over the next roundabout onto the dual carriageway and continue on the A21.
- At the next roundabout (after passing under one of the few '[Green Bridges](#)' in the UK) continue south on the A21.
- Passing two 'Woodlands for Sale signs' on the right-hand side, take the right turn signposted Bewl Water onto the Bewlbridge Lane.
- Continue on Bewlbridge Lane approx. 0.4 miles until you reach single green metal bar gate on the right-hand side with a 'Woodlands for Sale' sign alongside on the oak tree.

Heading north from Hastings on the A21

- Follow the A21 heading north out of Hastings.
- At Flimwell (about 16 miles from Hastings) stay on the A21 (crossing straight over the B2087) towards Lamberhurst.
- Continue north on the A21 for approx. 3.2 miles then take the left turn signposted Bewl Water onto the Bewlbridge Lane.
- Continue on Bewlbridge Lane for approx. 0.4 miles until you reach single green metal bar gate on the right-hand side with a 'Woodlands for Sale' sign alongside on the oak tree.


Once you arrive at the gate:

- Park in front of the single bar metal gate ensuring there is space for the gates to be accessed by vehicles.
- Walk under the gate and up the track past the telecom mast (on the right). Walk down the stoned track a further approx. 100 meters. The ride stop entrance to Hinge Wood is on the right-hand side with its boundaries marked in ORANGE.
- Sat Nav note: The post code TN3 8JH is for the point shown on the location map by the red dot.

Boundaries:

The boundaries of the wood are indicated with **ORANGE** markings.
