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Description

Norton Meadow, set in the rolling Herefordshire countryside near Monmouth, offers just over 3¼ acres of unspoiled, open land, an ideal canvas for nature lovers, conservationists, and those seeking a peaceful rural escape.

The photos capture the meadow across changing seasons, from the most recent images featuring tall summer grasses to earlier shots showcasing shorter swards and vibrant wildflower carpets in full bloom. A video is also included to offer a more immersive sense of the landscape and its tranquil surroundings.

This gently sloping meadow is enhanced by a working water trough (spring fed) in the northeast corner, a valuable resource for a new owner.

With no public rights of way, the meadow provides complete privacy, making it perfect for woodland creation, rewilding, or quiet family retreats. Formerly used for grazing and hay production, its rich landscape is now ripe for environmental projects or personal enjoyment.

Access is easy via a shared gate off an unnamed public road between Welsh Newton and Llanrothal, clearly marked with a Woodlands.co.uk sign on the access gate. A spacious, hard-standing parking area, shared with the neighbouring plot, makes year-round visits effortless for cars or campervans.

The boundaries are thoughtfully defined with lush hedgerows to the north that attract and support wildlife and a sturdy stockproof fence runs along the eastern and southern edges.

Along the western side, marked by timber stakes, offers a wonderful opportunity for new hedgerow planting, with potential for grant support.

Winding grass paths encourage peaceful strolls across the meadow, while its secluded setting makes it a true sanctuary for anyone looking to reconnect with nature, plant trees, or leave a lasting environmental legacy.

The purchasers of the meadow will be asked to enter into a <u>covenant</u> to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of adjoining woodlands and meadows.

Wildlife

Rabbits, deer, pheasants enliven Norton Meadow, offering shelter and sustenance. A closer inspection reveals well-trodden trails crisscrossing the meadow, the tell-tale signs of its flourishing ecosystem. A barn owl can often be spotted overhead as well as a plethora of other birds.

Access, tracks and footpaths

Access to the meadow is conveniently located next to the public highway and the secured access gate is shared between two meadows.

Norton Meadow comes with freehold title and there are no public rights of way across the land.

Rights and covenants

As is the case for all our meadows, the purchaser will be asked to enter into a <u>covenant</u> which serves to protect the peace and quiet of the meadow.

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Activities

This meadow is a perfect escape, offering a peaceful setting for occasional family camping or a rewarding space for those passionate about tree planting and wildlife conservation.

Local area and history

Welsh Newton sits just north of Monmouth, straddling the border between England and Wales. Though small, the village is rich in heritage, with over thirty archaeological sites, including the remains of *St Faith's Church* and the ancient *Pembridge Castle*. The area also features *Welsh Newton Common*, a registered piece of unowned land offering elevated views over the Wye Valley.

The **Monnow Valley**, meanwhile, is a tranquil ribbon of countryside shaped by the River Monnow, which forms part of the England-Wales border. The valley is a patchwork of meadows, woodlands, and rolling hills, with picturesque villages like Llanrothal and Ganarew nestled along its course. It's a haven for walkers, wildlife enthusiasts, and anyone drawn to peaceful, pastoral landscapes.

How to find this meadow

You are welcome to visit this meadow by yourself, but please ensure that you have a copy of these sales details with you - many of our meadows do not have mobile phone reception or internet access so we recommend either printing the details or downloading them to your phone/tablet/laptop.

Norton Meadow is conveniently accessed directly from an unnamed public highway which runs between the villages of Llanrothal and Welsh Newton (Herefordshire).

If travelling from the east direction the gate will be on your left hand side and can be identified by a woodlands.co.uk sign fixed to a new metal gate.

The gate will be padlocked for security reasons. You can park close to the gate here without obstructing the road.

We also ask that should you wish to view the meadow, that you carefully climb over the locked gate.

Monmouth is around a 15-minute drive to the south east.

Boundaries:


Northern: Mature Hedgerow which follows the line of the public highway leading to a convenient access gate


Southern: Stock fencing and leafy neighbouring land that provides privacy and shelter

Eastern: Stock fencing down the length of the meadow

Western: Wooden field stakes

Boundary features are marked with turquoise paint.
